RE: Request for Meeting: Week of 17 May 2010

Dear Ambassador Stille:

Warm greetings from the Aotearoa New Zealand Cluster Munition Coalition (ANZCMC). I am writing on behalf of the ANZCMC to request a meeting with you to discuss the ban on cluster munitions, a weapon that has caused immense civilian harm in countries around the world. We last wrote to the Embassy of Brazil on 27 October 2008, but did not receive a response.

The 2008 Convention on Cluster Munitions comprehensively prohibits cluster munitions, requires destruction of stockpiled cluster munitions within eight years and clearance of contaminated land within 10 years, and recognises the rights of individuals and communities affected by the weapon to receive assistance. This crucial agreement will enter into force on 1 August 2010, becoming binding international law for the 106 states that have signed.

Unfortunately, Brazil has not yet signed the Convention on Cluster Munitions.

We therefore would like to meet with you to discuss this issue, during the week of 17 May 2010 if possible. We would also like to urge Brazil to attend the Convention's First Meeting of States Parties, to be held in Vientiane, Lao PDR from 8-12 November 2010.

We look forward to hearing from you.
